

NEW ENERGY AT PGA SHOW BODES WELL FOR TOP GOLF PRODUCTS OF 2023

To say the 70th PGA Show at the massive Orange County Convention Center in Orlando was a departure from the two previous years is an understatement of epic proportions.

In 2021, there wasn't even a PGA Show, due to the COVID pandemic. Golf industry manufacturers and suppliers had to get out their message using whisper-down-the-lane tactics.

In 2022, the PGA Show was sparsely attended – by exhibitors, buyers and media – and an aura of fear hung over the entire event.

But in 2023 the energy and numbers were back.

No, not to the levels of the heyday in the early part of the 21st Century. But the Orange County Convention Center was buzzing. More than a few exhibitors reported that the PGA Show was one of the best they attended in recent years.

This definitely was not a scaled-down event like the one in 2022.

Across the board, the equipment, apparel and accessories manufacturers responded with a multitude of new products. There was technology and style breakthroughs and, it quickly become obvious, that the pent-up energy of the pandemic era produced some noticeable efforts for the new golf season.

Without further fanfare, here are the eye-catching new products of 2023.

AERO-SWING TRAINING AID



The idea of air resistance training has been around in golf for a long time but the new Aero-Swing training aid has taken the concept a step further. Using plastic "pineapples" on the end of a shaft, this tool is a variable air resistance product and is designed to pull the most amount of air into the "pineapples" right at the ball impact point.

The result is a swing that encounters some resistance at the start of the swing, the maximum amount of resistance at ball impact and, as you finish the swing, the resistance lets up quite a bit. Aero-Swing, and President Bill Orosz, won the top training aid award at the 2022 PGA Show, but not that many people noticed due to the sparse attendance. This year, attendees were noticing ... in droves.

Instead of trying to drive a battery-powered golf trolley with the use of a remote device that the golfer has to operate and steer, the Stride Follow Me Cart uses a transponder that just hooks to the back belt or pocket. The cart then follows the golfer wherever they go.

"What we did was took a golf bag and made it into an electric trolley, all in one," says Zero Friction president John Iacono. "We took the components of an electric trolley, with remote control and followme action, and we built it into a bag that is basically the size of a cart bag. There are two wheels on the front and a cantilevered wheel on the back. The cantilevered wheel sets down to the ground and gives it the extra stability and balance.

All you have to do is hit follow-me and go down the fairway, and you have your own personal caddie."



2023 SHOPRITE CLASSIC PREVIEW

By MIKE KERN, GALLOWAY, N.J. — Brooke Henderson, at 25 already one of Canada's best exports, has won 13 times on the LPGA Tour. And she's successfully defended twice, in 2016 at the Cambria Portland Classic and three years later at the Lotte Championship. And she won another event, the Meijer Classic, two times in three years (2017 and '19). So she has an idea of what it takes to keep her hands on a trophy. "It has been good to me when I've come in as the defending champion," she said during the recent media day for



the ShopRite LPGA Classic, where she will try to win back-to-back on June 9-11 on the Bay Course at Seaview. "When you step up to a place where you know you've played well in the past, you feel like your game plan, your strategy for the course is pretty good. It just gives you a lot of extra confidence. All golfers play better when you're confident and swinging it a bit more freely."

Last year, she rallied from way back on the final day to force a playoff, which she won over Lindsey Weaver-Wright by making an eagle on the par-5 18th hole. But Henderson, who would win her second major title at the Evian Championship a month later, has always fared well in South Jersey. Maybe it has something to do with the fact that this tournament gave her a sponsor's exemption almost a decade ago, when she was just getting started. She tied for 11th here in 2019, was sixth in 2020 and second in 2021. So it really wasn't too much of a surprise when she finally broke through last June. Only maybe in the way she did it. It was an impressive Sunday.

"It was so much fun and so exciting the way it finished out," Henderson acknowledged. "Going into the day I wasn't sure (I would do it). I thought maybe I was too far back to get the victory, but I was just trying to go as low as I could and see what would happen.

"Just tried to make a bunch of birdies. I was 5-under through the first nine holes, which was really something, and I saw my name climbing up the leaderboard quickly.

"So to shoot a bogey-free 64 on a Sunday, get into a playoff and win with an eagle, it was just really special. My parents were there and

my sister was on the bag and lots of family and friends were there to celebrate too. I think it's one of the best closing holes the way the fans are always there and so excited.

"I remember a few years ago watching Lexi (Thompson) win there with an eagle putt on 18," she continued. "I remember listening to the crowd's reaction and the hair stood up on my arms a little bit watching her win. At the time I just thought, man, that would be really cool to do that. So to be able to basically do that, it really meant a lot to me."

Henderson, ranked ninth in the world, began the season by winning the Tournament of Champions in January. In six starts since, she has missed the cut twice and had a best showing of 11th, at the Lotte in April. She couldn't be at the media day, which she had to do via zoom, after withdrawing from an event in North Jersey as she recovered from an illness. But she insisted that she's going to be ready again come June.

"Nothing too serious," she stressed. "Just had to take care of myself and heal a bit. I'm feeling much better now and energy levels are coming back. That's really encouraging and like I said, I'm back here practicing and getting myself set for the rest of the year ...

"It's kind of been a weird year, to be honest. I'm very happy about the win right out of the gate. It gave me a lot of high hopes about what was to come. Unfortunately, the schedule has been a little bit strange where we've had a lot of breaks and off time. I feel like it's been tough for me to get the game rolling consistently."

Of course, a return to Seaview, especially as the reigning winner, certainly can't hurt her outlook.



"One of the cooler things about ShopRite is the list of past champions," Henderson duly noted. "I was really proud to add my name to that list. The history, the tradition, it's been running for such a long time. All the good they do for the community (with \$40 million having been raised for charity). It's a tough golf course, too. I think the challenge keeps us coming back. It makes us better as players, and the event makes us better as people too.

"They were always good to me, and that has given me a little bit of extra motivation to play well. I think you have to remain patient and take what (the course) gives you. I think I've learned that over the past few years, and obviously with the win last year, I feel pretty confident with the strategy. As long as the ball striking is in a good place, I look forward to hopefully having another good finish this

"With this big stretch coming up the rest of the summer, I look forward to hopefully putting myself in contention and making some climbs on the weekend."

In other words, she's probably not done yet. It's a future worth pursuing.

"You know, I'm so grateful for the career that I've had so far," Henderson said. "Sometimes, I have to pinch myself because it's like when I was growing up I just wanted to play on the LPGA Tour and win out there. But you never really know if your dreams are going to come true. So far they have. It's been so much fun to compete against the best in the world, and I've been fortunate to raise 13 LPGA Tour trophies ... With that being said, I'm just trying to get better and keep pushing forward. Trying to keep aspiring to be the best I can on all levels, see what will happen in the next five or ten years. Not to get complacent and just keep pushing boundaries.

"It's hard to say what your goals are because you never really know what's going to happen. If you make small goals, hopefully that leads to bigger things. It's so crazy. I think I'm pretty young but then I look around and then I feel old."

How's that for perspective?

For the second straight year, Meaghan Francella, a teaching professional at Philadelphia Cricket Club, will be in the field on a sponsor's exemption. Last June she opened with a 68 but missed the cut with a second-round 78. Back in 2007, in her second start, she beat Annika Sorenstam in a four-hole playoff to win the MasterCard Classic. It would be her lone victory. But at 41, this is certainly a week to look forward to, for all the right reasons.



"I'm not obviously playing every week like everybody else, but I'm doing the best I can with the time I have (to prepare)," she said. "My expectations aren't what they used to be, which is good. I don't do this full time any more. But I'll be ready. I'm not concerned about that.

"I think realistically I want to have fun. That's number one. That's really the goal. I'm not going to be doing this for a lot longer. Who knows how many more LPGA events I'll get in moving forward, if I even want to get in any LPGA events moving forward. I just want to enjoy myself. Realistically I know I can still compete. I proved it last year (in round one). Then my expectation level went through the roof."

It happens. Nothing wrong with that. And maybe there will be an encore. For both of them. See you there, at what has become the biggest sporting event in South Jersey. And there's not even a close second. So continue to support the cause. And maybe catch a glimpse of some talented golfers doing some special things. That's something we can all root for.

VALLEY FORGE AREA PROVIDES PERFECT SETTING FOR INTERNATIONAL NETWORK OF GOLF SPRING FORUM

Being in the right place at the right time always has been a perfect formula for success.

The Greater Valley Forge area always has been the right place. Just ask George Washington.



But now is also the perfect time for the development of business and tourism activity in this exploding hub that sits less than 20 miles away from downtown Philadelphia ... and in the heart of America's East Coast megalopolis.

While the pandemic hurt every level of every area in America, Valley Forge is a shining light that blasted out of one of the darkest economic times in American history with a new vigor. Housing, business development, retail and sports and recreation are just some of the sectors that have blossomed in Valley Forge ... and throughout surrounding Montgomery County.

"We have been very fortunate," says Mike Bowman, president of the Valley Forge Tourism and Convention Board. "People see the Valley Forge area as the best of both worlds. Once the dates were set and the room space was reserved, the ING Spring Forum quickly took shape and began to gain momentum.

Sponsors – such as Yuengling Brewery, Caliber Golf, Makefield Putters and the Four Yards More Tee have jumped on board.

Highlighting the educational aspects of the ING Spring Forum will be a marketing/social media seminar conducted by longtime ING member and marketing executive Patricia (Tiss) Dahan.

She has spent nearly two decades developing sales and marketing strategies and plans, and leading teams in four different industries. Much of that time was spent with TaylorMade-adidas Golf as Vice President, Global Apparel. Five months ago she became CEO of English Riding Supply, Inc. in Pennsylvania. She also is certified in professional and job-transition coaching.

On the golf side, Pennsylvania-based architect Ed Shearon will be addressing the group at Raven's Claw, one of the many courses he designed or renovated. He also will be available for interviews on golf course architecture, as well as the business side of golf course operation.

"It's exciting to see this event and the organization come to my home state," admits Frank Carroll, president of Greenkeepers, a successful golf accessory company based in Northeast Philadelphia. Carroll

also is an active ING member, who has built quite a reputation on the business side of the golf world. "We will be showing off Pennsylvania and Valley Forge, in particular, to high profile people from across the country."

Portions of the ING Conference, the Valley Forge Casino Resort, the Valley Forge area, Raven's Claw Golf Club and Yuengling Brewery will be shot for the two episodes of the award-winning Traveling Golfer television show. 

A GOLF TRIP TO THE SANDHILLS WITH A U.S. OPEN HOLDING COURT

With early planning, you can watch the 2024 U.S. Open at Pinehurst No. 2 in the morning and play golf in the Sandhills of North Carolina that afternoon. While you might not be able to get that coveted tee time to tackle the turtle-back greens on the Donald Ross-designed gem, don't leave those clubs home.

Phil Werz, the president and CEO of the Pinehurst Southern Pines Aberdeen Area Convention and Visitors Bureau, urges golfer-spectators from the Northeast to make their play as fast as John Daly when he's 15 strokes out on a Sunday morning.



"I would recommend that anyone who is coming to the 2024 U.S. Open to book now," said Werz. "Golf will be available if you book early enough but it's the lodging. We are so limited here with 2,300 hotel rooms and many already committed by the USGA, etc. Short-term rentals have doubled in size to around 600. So, the short-term rentals is probably the best route if you are going to book now."

Tickets for the U.S. Open (June 10-16, 2024) at the Donald-Ross-designed iconic layout do not go on sale until later this year but you can volunteer now.

However, arranging for your lodging should be your first priority and Werz's team will have a website full of possibilities once those '24 Open tickets are available.

"At Home of Golf.com, when the tickets go on sale live, we will have a special landing page that will take people to lodging in Moore County but will also take you to Fayetteville, Chatham County, Lee County, Raleigh, and other places," Werz said. "There will be a high demand once those tickets go on sale. That will be in May or June from what the USGA tells me."

Successful planning points to booking airfares and rental cars early as well.

Prices for lodging might also reach a spiking point based on demand,

Werz said.

"That's why it's important to book now," Werz said. "Obviously, the hotels and the short-term rental owners know that is going to be an opportunity for a rate increase. There will be a spike, so the earlier you book the better. But they talk to each other so there will be some consistency."

Rates for properties within walking distance will be the highest and will decrease the farther away you make your choice.

According to Werz, there should be good availability at many of the Sandhills area courses that are challenging and fun.

"Courses like Talamore, Mid South, Pine Needles, Mid Pines, Southern Pines GC, Legacy and even Hyland, Beacon Ridge, Foxfire, and others farther out are some good opportunities to book some golf and play and watch some U.S. Open or watch some competition and then play in the afternoon. I would book your lodging now because there is such a high demand and there is a lot of saturation in the market now a year out."

With nearly 40 courses within a 15-mile radius, the Sandhills offers a convenient selection that has earned great reviews. Here's the link from the CVB.

The golf and stay packages for the Resort on Carolina Vista during its fourth U.S. Open on No. 2 can be found here but remember choices will be somewhat limited.

Food and drink is the next question that begs an answer and the Sandhills, literally, satisfies.

"We have been trying to position this area as one of the best foodie/golf destinations in the country," Werz said, while listing tasty options in the Village, Southern Pines, Aberdeen, and other locations.

In nearby Southern Pines, a section of town is called Red's Corner and features a plethora of food and beverage options.

"Red's Corner is the state's only permanent food truck/beer pavilion," Werz said. "They have 12 beers on tap. You want Italian, you want Asian, you want Greek, you want ice and cookies? They have everything for everybody. It is a cool place, and they have entertainment. It will be hot next June but they have canopies so you can sit in shaded areas.

In addition, the Village of Pinehurst is likely to have special events, but a schedule is not set.

"Once we get four to six months out, we'll have a better idea of what the program will be off the golf course," Werz said.

The almost therapeutic weather in the Sandhills gives it another strong option, according to Werz.



"This is a great outdoor destination," he said. "2023 is the Year of the Trail in North Carolina. That will go beyond the calendar year though. We have 36 trails throughout Moore County. We want to boost and amplify getting people getting on our trails. In 2023, we have a program called the Pinecone Pathways Program. We coordinated with Starworks, and we have 100 glass pinecones that we hide on the trails. It's basically the largest scavenger hunt in North Carolina."

The parks and arboretums of the area offer natural areas of respite and beauty.

Arts and music can also fill a visitor's schedule.

Werz also suggests Seagrove, the home of the largest collection of potters in the nation, as a place for touring and shopping and it is only a 45-minute drive from the Sandhills.

He also predicts that music will feature prominently in events during the U.S. Open with the Neon Rooster in Aberdeen and the Bell Tree Tavern in Southern Pines as prime possibilities.

With all of those amenities swirling in your head like a swing thought, remember, the primary mission is to get there to enjoy it all. Book it all and then you can choose between Ship Sticks and lugging the bag on the plane.

HUNTSVILLE'S LUGIANO TOPS AM. QUALIFYING

Huntsville Golf Club's Robert Lugiano carded a 4-under-par 67 to earn medalist honors in BMW Philadelphia Amateur Qualifying Tuesday at Berwick Golf Club (par 71, 6,493 yards).

Lugiano, 21, of Jackson Township, Pa., led the field earning one of two qualifying positions and ties available for the Championship proper. The cut line stopped at 1-under-par 70.

The 123rd BMW Philadelphia Amateur Championship will take place June 12-14 & 17 at Huntingdon Valley Country Club in Huntingdon Valley, Pa.

BMW Philadelphia Amateur Championship

Originating in 1897, the Amateur Championship is GAP's premiere individual event. Philadelphia Cricket Club's Albert H. Smith captured the first Amateur Championship by defeating J.D. Winsor of Merion Cricket Club in 37 holes. The event's format switched to medal play in 1938. J. Wood Platt went on to win two consecutive Amateurs under that format. His brother William "Zimmer" Platt earned the 1940 title at Philadelphia Cricket Club by being the only competitor to finish all 72 holes. The event's format reverted back to match play in 1941. The Amateur Championship wasn't contested from 1943-45 because of World War II. Overall, 34 courses have hosted the Amateur.





HUNTSVILLE'S WERNER PLANS 100-HOLE HIKE



An estimated 6.7 million Americans are living with Alzheimer's Dementia according to the Alzheimer's Association. Included in that group is Nick Werner's grandfather Robert (Bob) Ashton.

Alzheimer's is a type of dementia that affects memory, thinking and behavior. Symptoms eventually grow severe enough to interfere with daily tasks.

After learning about the disease through his grandfather's diagnosis in 2018, Werner has decided to do his part to support the Alzheimer's Association. On May 30, Werner will participate in a 100-hole hike to raise money for the Alzheimer's Association at Huntsville Golf Club, where he is a member.

"Watching my grandfather's cognitive decline has been one of the hardest things I've had to deal with as a young adult," Werner, a rising junior at Wyoming Seminary, wrote on his Alzheimer's Association donation page. "We've spent so many hours on the golf course together and I cherish those memories. He has been my biggest supporter and strongest inspiration to continue working hard and playing the game I love."

Support from his parents, Joe and Susan Werner, family members and fellow Huntsville members has encouraged Werner to meet his goal of raising \$2,000 for the research, awareness and advocacy of people impacted by Alzheimer's. Currently, his donations sit at \$5,865. Since he has surpassed his original goal by nearly \$3,000, he has identified a new goal of raising \$6,000 for the Alzheimer's Association.

"My family has been very supportive ever since I told them about the idea," Werner, 15, of Wilkes-Barre, Pa. said. "My father in particular has been helpful with setting up the technical stuff [like] getting the golf course reserved. I can't thank the head pro [Matt Occhiato] at Huntsville enough for letting me play."

"Members have come up to me and told me how good of a cause it is," Werner said. "It's been really nice to see all the [members] being so supportive of it."

Werner will begin his first of over five and a half rounds of golf on Tuesday as soon as the sun rises.

"I'm obviously hoping to play well, I'll keep track," Werner said. "After a hundred holes, less than 10-over would be [great]. It's a difficult golf course."

Battista and Wolfe met each other while playing in the inaugural GAP Women's Championship last year at Bala Golf Club. Wolfe, the Golf Course Superintendents Association of America's Mid-Atlantic field staff representative, and Lynch, Lehigh University's Women's golf coach, are old college friends who reconnected over social media. Battista and Beck are frequent names on GAP Women's event tee sheets. Beck is also a tournament volunteer and member of GAP's Women's Committee.

But the group's early foundations can be pointed towards GAP's Four-Player Team event.

"[The group] started with Jackie and I texting. We had played a couple years in the [Four-Player Team]," said Wolfe, who alongside Beck won the event's Women's Division in both 2021 and 2022. "[GAP's Women's Schedule] came out and we were like 'We need to start recruiting people,' so we recruited [Grace and Mary Kate for today]. We are also going to take them to the Four-Player Team."



Whaley receives Walter Hagen Award during 2023 PGA Championship

he 2023 PGA Championship, held at Oak Hill Country Club in Rochester NY, is in the history books with Brooks Koepka capturing his third PGA win and 5th major of his career. It came alongside PGA club pro Michael Block nearly stealing the moment with a stunning hole-in-one on the par 3, 15th hole on Sunday, and a magical up and down from the heavy ough on the 18th to achieve a top-15 finish and a qualifying spot to return o the PGA next year.

Since 1956, Oak Hill's famed East Course has hosted six majors including three U.S. Opens and three PGA Championships, along with the Ryler Cup, Senior U.S. Open, Senior PGA Championship and U.S. Amateur. Rochester was also an annual stop for the LPGA Tour including a major championship from 1977-2014.

The city and its residents have a unique love affair with the game both is players and fans that can be traced back to the hometown roots of one of the most colorful, successful and historical figures in professional golf, *N*alter Hagen.

Hagen, aka "The Haig," was born on December 21, 1892. The Haig grew

up in the game becoming one of golf's most flamboyant and captivating sports figures of the early 20th century. He was considered the world's first full-time tournament professional, a career that began at the age of seven, working as a caddie at the Country Club of Rochester to help pay the family bills. CCR, as it is locally known and is another Donald Ross gem, was located across the street from Hagen's boyhood home. He rose to become to the head golf professional of the club in 1913.

Known for his dashing clothes and showmanship, Hagen won his first professional tournament at the age of 21. His impressive career included 58 professional tour victories, including 11 major championships. He was the first American-born player to win The Open Championship and served as Captain of the U.S. team in the first six Ryder Cups. Hagen was a founding Member of the PGA of America in 1916 and helped to popularize golf by playing hundreds of exhibitions around the world. He was the first golfer to earn a million dollars in his career and helped raised the status of professional golfers as well as their earnings.

In 2019, in honor of the legendary golfer, the Country Club of Roch-

ster initiated and presented the first Walter Hagen Ambassador of the ame Award to recognize "individuals who contribute to the growth of 1e game."

"Mr. Hagen opened the doors of clubs and courses around the world to rofessional golfers, previously only open to the 'elite,' commented Matt arrilli, President of the CCR Board of Stewards. "By doing so he crossed the threshold of inclusion for many to enjoy and compete in the game of olf."

This year's Walter Hagen Ambassador of the Game award was present-1 to LPGA Professional, Suzy Whaley during a formal ceremony at CCR 12 week of the PGA Championship. Seth Waugh, the CEO of the PGA of merica, attended the event along with members of the PGA's executive adership and a cross section of industry professionals.

A dual member of the PGA of America and LPGA Teaching & Club Prossional division, Whaley is truly in a league of her own as one of the lost accomplished and distinguished professional golfers and instructors the game.

Whaley was the first woman ever elected to serve as an Officer of the PGA of America and the first female to serve as President of the PGA of America. She famously qualified and

played in the 2003 Greater Hartford Open becoming the first woman since Babe Zaharias in 1945 to qualify for a PGA Tour event. Shortly before, Whaley became the first PGA of America female professional to win the Connecticut PGA Championship. Her numerous state victories and milestones resulted in Whaley being inducted into the Connecticut Golf Hall of Fame.

Her tournament resume is long and notable including her recent participation in the 2022 PGA Cup, the PGA Club Professional Championship, the USGA Senior Women's Open, and the LPGA Senior Women's Championship.

"To receive an honor named after Walter Hagen is extremely gratifying and humbling because few people had a greater impact on the game than he did," Whaley said. "He had few peers as a player. His 11 major titles trail only Jack Nicklaus (18) and Tiger Woods (15). And people forget that

he captained the first six U.S. Ryder Cup teams."

The 56-year-old Whaley has been a trailblazer in her own right with her numerous accomplishments, awards, and break-the-glass-ceiling moments for women's golf along with her leadership roles with the PGA and LPGA in growing the game. She handles it all with a unique grace and ease and a welcoming and approachable style that is immediately apparent from her warm and radiant smile.

Second to none is Whaley's love, dedication and commitment to teaching the game. Whaley has conducted

undreds of youth clinics and coached various cams that have won national and international nurnaments. A native of Syracuse, NY, Whaley is a 1989 gradate of the University of North Carolina with a



PGA MEMBER BRIAN BERGSTOL WINS 25TH HAVERFORD PHILADELPHIA PGA CLASSIC AND \$150,000 PRIZE IN SUDDEN DEATH PLAYOFF



Plymouth Meeting, Pa. (May 30, 2023) — Reigning Philadelphia PGA Professional Champion Brian Bergstol of Shawnee Inn & Golf Resort in Shawnee on the Delaware, Pennsylvania, won the 25th Haverford Philadelphia PGA Classic at Sunnybrook Golf Club by tapping in a one-foot par on the first sudden death playoff hole to top Jeff Herb, PGA, of Waynesborough Country Club in Paoli, Pennsylvania. Bergstol's \$150,000 winner's check is the largest first-place prize available from any event across the PGA of America's 41 nationwide Sections.

Bergstol made four birdies and three bogies en route to a 1-under-par 71 to tie Herb, who finished his round earlier in the afternoon. Bergstol said the course played "super hard," and went on to remark it was one of the hardest tournament course setups he has played.

Bergstol went on to thank the event's title partner, The Haverford Trust Company, their founder and director George Connell, Sunnybrook Golf Club and its membership, and staff, for their dedication to the Philadelphia PGA Section and its nearly 900 PGA Professionals.

PGA Associate Zach Barbin Wins 2023 Delaware Valley Open Championship "I look forward to this event every year," said Bergstol.

Bergstol has won two of the Section's biggest tournaments over the course of the nine months, having claimed the 101st Philadelphia PGA Professional Championship at DuPont C.C. in September, and now the 25th Haverford Philadelphia PGA Classic.

In the Senior Division, PGA Member Dave McNabb, Applebrook G.C., took top honors with his 1-over-par round of 73. Green Valley C.C.'s John Cooper, PGA, and PGA Life Member George Forster finished in second place, one stroke behind McNabb. Three PGA Members rounded out the top five at 3-over-par: Barry Dear, Blue Heron Pines G.C.; Dave Quinn, Laurel Creek C.C.; and John Pillar, C.C. at Woodloch Springs.

Steve Wetherill Jr. finished with Low Amateur honors after turning in a 1-over-par 73 to top Frank Natale by five strokes.

PGA Associate Zach Barbin Wins 2023 Delaware Valley Open Championship

West Chester, Pa. (May 22, 2023) — PGA Associate Zach Barbin of Chesapeake Bay Golf Club in Rising Sun, Md., turned in a 4-under-par 68 to win the 2023 Delaware Valley Open Championship at Radley Run Country Club by one stroke over PGA Members Steve Sanderson, Saucon Valley C.C., Zac Oakley, Bidermann G.C.; and Alex Knoll, Glen Brook G.C.

Barbin made six birdies en route to his victory, and only had one blemish on his scorecard (a double bogey on No. 10). The lead was at 3-under-par for most of the day, but Barbin made back-to-back birdies on Nos. 15 and 16 to tie, and ultimately take the lead.

The event is a Philadelphia PGA Rolex / The Haverford Trust Company Player of the Year tournament and the second Silvercrest Cup qualifier of the year. Returning for the second year, the Silvercrest Cup series will include four qualifying events for Philadelphia PGA Professionals, and will culminate in a \$30,000 Silvercrest Cup final, hosted at Applebrook Golf Club in Malvern, Pa. In addition to receiving the winner's share of the purse, Barbin also took home an additional \$2,500 from the Silvercrest Cup qualifier bonus pool.

Three PGA Professionals tied four fourth place, two strokes behind the winner:

Gregg Meyer, Woodstone C.C.; Joanna Coe, Merion G.C.; and Bryan Saxon, Lehigh C.C.

Laurel Creek C.C.'s Dave Quinn fired a 1-under-par 71 to claim a one-stroke victory in the Senior Division over John Spina, Philadelphia Cricket Club. Four PGA Professionals tied for third place at 2-over-par: Hugo Mazzalupi, Linfield National G.C.; PGA Life Member Brian Kelly; Rob Rohrbach, Foxchase G.C.; and Terry Hatch, Royal Oaks G.C.

Kelly, who recently retired from Bucknell G.C., took top honors in the Super Senior Division, bettering six of his fellow PGA Professionals by one stroke: Bill Sautter, Philadelphia Cricket Club; Mike Moses, Concord C.C.; Bob Lennon, Wilmington C.C.; George Forster, Radnor Valley C.C.; Greg Farrow, Deerwood C.C.; and Dave Roberts, Cedarbrook C.C.

The Philadelphia Assistants' Organization (PAO) held an event concurrently with the Delaware Valley Open, with Barbin also walking away with a winner's check in that event. Oakley and Knoll finished in second place, followed by Saxon in fourth, and Rusty Harbold, Philadelphia Cricket Club, in fifth place at 1-under-par.

Two amateurs competed in the field this year, with Nathan Myers, Moselem Springs G.C., taking Low Amateur honors with a 12-over-par 84.




